## **How to Paint a Rain Barrel**

## **Supplies**

- Plastic Rain Barrel
- Dish soap
- Vinegar
- Scrubbing pad or fine grit sand paper
- Household eraser pad
- Plastic Primer spray
- Acrylic paint (spray or craft paint)
- Stencils (optional)
- Polyurethane spray

## Instructions

- 1. Remove any fittings from the barrel if possible.
- 2. Clean the barrel using dish soap and water and rinse. This is a good time to clean the inside of the barrel too.
- 3. Clean the barrel using 50/50 mix of water and vinegar to remove any lubricant that may have been present during manufacturing process. You can also use a mild degreaser as well
- 4. Prepare the outside of the barrel for the primer by roughening it up using a scrubbing pad (Scotch Brite green pad) or very fine-grit sand paper (800-1000). Do not use anything that could gouge the plastic. Move in circular motion as if waxing a car.
- 5. Go over the barrel again using a household eraser pad (think Mr. Clean magic eraser), moving in a circular motion.
- 6. Using a primer made for plastic, spray an even coat over the entire barrel. Use one spray can for a 55-gallon barrel. You can get either clear or white primer based on your preference. This is a very important step to help the final paint stick. Use the instructions on the can and allow it to dry.
- 7. Now you can paint your barrel with an acrylic paint. If painting a solid color you can use one full can of spray paint per 55-gallon barrel. If you would like to do a more intricate design, you can use crafters acrylic paint and use a paintbrush to apply it. This is a great time to use stencils too. Allow your paint to fully dry before going to the next step.
- 8. Now that you have your barrel painted, you will want to use a full can of clear sealant spray such as polyurethane to protect your paint against weathering. Allow the sealer to fully dry before moving on.
- 9. Now that your barrel is fully painted and sealed, you can re-install your fittings and hook up your rain barrel.
